City Administrator/Clerk Renslow stated that SRF approved the City's application for a Planning & Design (P&D) loan for \$245,000 and this loan would cover engineering and design costs for the HWY 210 water transmission replacement project and the well #10 access road construction project. The total cost for both projects is approximately \$1,500,000. The P&D loan is 0% interest for up to 3 years and can be rolled into an SRF construction loan or may be repaid upon getting permanent financing.
